


CHRISTOPHER GUY

Each creation pays homage to its physical origins... A parade of rain-trees graces the entrance of the spectacular Christopher Guy workshop complex in the heart of the island of Java. A long river-stone cobbled drive leads through thick faded ochre perimeter walls and a dramatic solid limestone entrance. Deep within the estate lies an imposing amphitheatre which seats 600, designed in authentic Roman style complete with two spa pools spouting natural spring water via a myriad of fountains and cascades. The lush grounds are home to exotic trees and plants along with rare species of butterflies, accentuating the idyllic working atmosphere of these unique facilities. The bell-tower marks the tallest point of the workshops, designed to reflect both the Moorish and European traditions central to the Christopher Guy soul.
